# An Unexpected Opportunity for Happy Trails Farm Animal Sanctuary



Take a look at Happy Trails new educational facility;

a big, beautiful home and barn, located on 5 acres connected to Happy Trails current pastures. This exciting acquisition will provide so much: more parking, more pastures, and classroom and office space.

It has long been our dream to expand the Happy Trails facility with an educational center and spacious grassy pastures for larger rescued animals.

Well, our dream just fell into our lap in a big way!

A very nice home on five acres of land iust two doors down from Happy Trails on New Milford Road has been empty for the past three years. An older but sturdy barn stands behind the four-bedroom split-level home and the back four-acre pasture of the fiveacre property connects along the treeline to Happy Trails' wooded area.

chase at a Sheriff's sale within the week. The sale was to take place on Monday, December 15<sup>th</sup> at the Portage County Court House.

After a great deal of thought and discussion we decided that

acquiring this property would be key to many things for Happy Trails. The flat land out back would be perfect to fence in pastures for rescued horses. The abundant grass available in the spring and summer would offset hay costs. The barn would give us an overflow area for animals requiring quarantine and for emergencies. The large home on the property would be ideal for meeting rooms and classrooms for our ever-expanding educational programs: Horse Health seminars, Compassionate Kids programs, Animal Care clinics, animal-friendly cooking classes, volunteer orientations, and more

on a year-round basis. This property offered not only the opportunity to increase Happy Trails current services, but to enhance our efforts to be self-sustaining.

We bid on the property at the

Sheriff's auction and are now busy securing a loan to cover the sale and for some basic necessary repairs. The down payment, property cost and related auction fees total \$159,500. Now, the goal of our land acquisition campaign is to raise as much of this purchase price as possible within 60 days of the sale (December 15th). That's how long we have to complete the transaction. Time is of the essence!

#### **ALL THE POSITIVES**

Compared to other properties on the market, this purchase had many great things to offer:

- With the existing home there is no need to drill a well, and a septic system is already in place.
- The older 24' x 32' barn is solid, and the cement floor is in good condition.

Happy Trails is a leader in animal rescue and in helping people connect with animals. Our vision of promoting peace and healing for both people and animals is crystal clear.



- An attached garage provides the option for additional machinery or equipment storage, or to convert the space into more educational rooms.
- Since the property adjoins our existing property, it's a natural addition to the sanctuary allowing easy access to existing pastures where the rescued horses are currently turned out.
- It will offer additional parking to compensate the lack of parking at Happy Trails main facility.


